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OBLIGATIONS – LEAPFROGS 2023

If you receive a Leapfrogs cheque, you're obligated to work with your project full-time, meaning you should not study or work during the Leapfrog project time. You are also committed to participate in follow-up activities. The follow-up activities are not there to be a burden but rather a way for you to gain more experience that you can apply to future projects and a way for us to see your process in your current project.

We want to be close to the project and see how it proceeds. Of course, we will meet occasionally (digitally or in-person), but the most important channels for follow-up are the

- Status updates
- The workshops
- The post-project survey.

At the end of the project time, we would like to hear what you have accomplished and learned during the Leapfrog project.

Project updates

Everyone who receives a Leapfrog cheque is obligated to document the project's progress via Leapfrogs status updates. These updates will be shared in our internal Slack workspace. They will be shared with the other Leapfrog students, as we want you to share your experiences and challenges that you encounter while working on your project. We also want you to interact with other Leapfroggers and take the opportunity to support each other and share lessons.

We do not want to impose strict requirements regarding the content of your status updates, but if you fail to participate, we reserve the right to withdraw future payments. Following are the minimum requirements concerning your activity (note that minor changes can occur prior to the start of the projects):



- Three status updates during the Leapfrogs project in English

Workshops

The first workshop is the approximately two-hour kick-off meeting in May (date tba). This is when the Leapfrog check will officially be handed out. Participation in this workshop is mandatory for the Leapfrogs participants.

The workshops throughout the Leapfrog period serve as a support function for the Leapfrogs participants by providing skills and networking opportunities. These workshops are normally arranged in beginning/mid-June and mid/end of August.

You will also be assigned a peer-group consisting of other participants, and we expect you to participate as a peer. The purpose of the peer-group is to enable participants to share experiences and lessons learned also between workshop sessions.
