OBLIGATIONS

If you receive a Leapfrogs cheque you need to work with your project full-time, meaning you should not study or work meanwhile. You are also committed to participate in the follow-up activities. The follow-up activities should not be burdensome, but show that you are still running your project and also be a way to extract experience for future projects.

We want to be close to the project and see how it goes. Of course, we will meet occasionally, but the most important channels for follow-up are the Leapfrog blog, the workshops and the surveys when you have completed your Leapfrogsproject time. At the end of the project we are also looking forward to hear what you have accomplished and learned during the Leapfrogs project.

The blog

Everyone who receives a leapfrog cheque is obligated to document the project progress in the Leapfrogs Blog. We would like you to share your experiences and the challenges you face throughout the project. We also want you to interact with other Leapfroggers and take the opportunity to support and learn from each other. Furthermore, the blog is a way to market your project for the public!

We do not want to impose strict requirements regarding the content of your blog posts but if you fail to participate we reserve the right to withdraw future payments. Following are the minimum requirements concerning your activity on the blog (note that minor changes can occur prior to the start of the projects):

- Minimum three blog posts during the Leapfrogs project relating to the current status of your project.
- The blog posts should be in English

Workshops

The first workshop is the kick-off meeting, preliminary date 23/5. This is the moment when the Leapfrogscheck will officially be handed out. Participation on this workshop is mandatory for the Leapfrogs participants.

The workshops throughout the period, one in June and one in August, serve as a support function for participants, providing skills and networking opportunities. We strongly recommend the participants to attend these workshops which also are part of the follow-up activities.
